

The present mode of teaching involves traditional methods. ICT enabled teaching learning process has been introduced in the departments of Computer Science and Chemistry. This may be extended to the other departments as well. Study tours may be introduced particularly in the Departments of Botany and Zoology. Continuous evaluation system should be introduced for all courses.

Yes, the Committee is partially satisfied with the type of courses being offered. More postgraduate courses may be introduced mainly in the Science subjects.

11. Whether all the teachers are in favour of getting autonomous status to the College, Yes/ No (Give reasons in detail as to whether the Committee interacted with the teachers separately so as to ascertain their views for and against, if any.)

The College was conferred Autonomy since 1999. The Committee members interacted with the teachers to get their feedback regarding their experiences of working in an Autonomous College. But, a section of teachers were of the opinion that, there is an acute shortage of regular staff and adequate infrastructure.

12. Any other information, which the Committee feels will help UGC in taking decision to grant autonomy or continuation of Autonomous status to this College.

A rationalization of the semester system and further examination reforms would make the autonomous status of the college more meaningful. Orientation courses would also make the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) more effective.

13 Examination Reforms

Whether the Committee is satisfied with the present mode of the examination being conducted by the College? Any specific method of evaluation, which the Committee would like to suggest to them may be indicated.

The College follows the examination pattern of the affiliating University. Semester system has been introduced. Code numbers are assigned in place of roll numbers. Questions are set by the faculty members of other institutions, and fifty percent of the answer scripts are evaluated by external examiners. In case of setting of questions, a 60.40 ratio is maintained so far as the essay-type and short-answer type questions are concerned. Photocopies of evaluated answer scripts are provided to the candidates on request after the review results are published.

14. Interaction with Students/ Non-teaching staff. Give specific comments in detail for such interaction undertaken

14(a) Students

- (i) The students are of the opinion that, the teachers are competent, and the courses are completed as
- The girl students mentioned about the shortage of adequate sanitary facilities in the College;
- (iii) There is absence of a proper canteen in the college;
- (iv) The results are sometimes published as late as three months after the conduct of the examinations;
- (v) Some buildings are in a dilapidated condition, and the concerned departments need to be shifted elsewhere.

14(b) Non-teaching staff

- (i) They are receiving all kinds of cooperation and guidance from the authorities;
- (ii) They would prefer to have a training in computers for regular office work;
- (iii) There is an acute shortage of staff at every level;
- (iv) They would also prefer at least 1% reservation for their wards in case of admission to the college.

15. Administrative Activities (for review of Autonomous Status College only)

Whether the Governing Body, Academic Council, Board of Studies and Finance Committee meeting are being conducted by the College periodically or not. Specific comments in details with regard to resolutions passed by the above bodies in the recent past may be given.

The meetings of the concerned bodies need to be conducted more frequently. In particular, the Finance Committee meetings should be conducted at least twice a year, as prescribed in the UGC Guidelines for Autonomous Colleges.

16. Comments regarding the Self-financing courses being offered

The Members were informed that Computer Science and BBA have been introduced and the response is satisfactory. The Add-on course on Journalism and Mass Communication is popular among students. However, the Add-on course on Business English, introduced in 2010, had to be withdrawn in 2015, due to poor response.

17. Comments regarding the fee structure being in force

The Committee Members were informed that the fee structure (Annexure – XXI) now in force in the College has been determined by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Odisha.

18. NAAC rating awarded, if not comments thereof:

The College was awarded Grade B (CGPA of 2.61) in 2014 (Annexure-VII).

19. Financial Utilization of UGC funds: Specific comments be given. (Give details of Autonomy Grant/ General Development grant, if any received by the college for the last five years separately.)

The details, as provided by the College, are at Annexure – XXII. The Autonomy Grant for 2014-15 was not fully utilized.

The financial utilization of UGC funds during the X Plan and XI Plan are enclosed at Annexure – XXIII Unutilized amounts out of the allocation towards PTAC had to be refunded (X Plan). Unutilized amounts out of the allocation towards Merged Schemes, CPE Grant, and Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship had to be refunded (XI Plan).

20. Observations and Suggestions of the Committee

20(a) Background of the College:

20(b) Merits/ Observations

- (i) The College has experienced and dedicated teaching staff and committed support staff;
- (ii) The infrastructural facilities include, among others, language lab, computer hub, conference hall and a furnished reading room inside the library;
- (iii) The college authorities have taken initiative recently to make the campus Wi-fi enabled;
- (iv) There is a bank with ATM facility, a post office, and a cooperative store within the college campus;
- (v) The College has been selected for implementing the UGC scheme of Community Colleges for the expansion of skill-based programmes
- (vi) It serves as IGNOU Study Centre and Odisha Open University Study Centre.
- (vii) There is a Computer Education Project, which is a joint venture with the Govt. of Odisha;
- (viii) The College has introduced CBCS from 2015-16;
- (ix) Padmashree Jayanta Mohapatra and Padmashree Manoj Das Heritage Corner in the library is an archive for storing the creative writings of these two eminent writers;
- (x) The College has units of National Cadet Corps (NCC), National Service Scheme (NSS) and Youth Red Cross (YRC) and Rovers.

20(c) Demerits/ Suggestions

- (i) The number of teaching staff and support staff is inadequate;
- (ii) The number of research publications during the last five years, as reported by the College, is only nine;
- (iii) Funds remain unutilized;
- (iv) The dilapidated buildings need to be renovated immediately.
- (v) For the self-financing courses, the concerned resource persons/guest teachers are not being currently paid honorarium as prescribed by the UGC.

21. Recommendations of the Committee:

The Committee unanimously recommends the extension of Autonomous Status to Fakir Moha-Autonomous College, Balasore, Odisha, affiliated to Fakir Mohan University, for a period of six academic years, with effect from 2015-2016 to 2020-2021, with ex post facto approval for the period 2015-2016.
